Membership: Must be a current member of USA Archery, National Field Archery Association or a member of a World Archery member association. You must be a USAA member to receive National Ranking points. Your World Archery member association must be in good financial standing with World Archery to be allowed to compete.

DEADLINES: **REGISTRATION IS CLOSED.**

If your name is not on this list you are not registered.

After registration closes, you can be put on the waiting list with a paid entry. If we are unable to place you into the tournament, you will receive a refund.

Open Individuals: Final registration forms and payment must be ~~received by March 11, 2013~~ Space is limited to the field capacity and may close before March 11, so register early. There is no on-site registration. Payment must be received at time of final registration to reserve a shooting position. If venue does reach capacity, a waiting list in order received will be maintained.

Late Fee: add \$50.00 US per archer, Registrations received after March 11, 2013 will be assessed a late fee. Late entries will be accepted in order received as field capacity permits.

Official Teams: ~~Preliminary form is due by February 11, 2013 IMMEDIATELY~~ Teams that have submitted Preliminary forms are listed in the entry list. Preliminary forms are not longer being accepted

For teams that have already submitted preliminary forms, note that the Final form and payment is due ~~by March 4, 2013~~ **AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.** Late Fee: add \$50.00 US per archer for final registrations received after March 4, 2013.

Host Hotel: Negotiated group rate ends March 11, 2013 or earlier until room block sells out.

Cancellations: Through March 11 will receive a full refund. A \$50 fee will be withheld after March 11. Email notification of cancellation is acceptable. No refunds after March 28, 2013 (one week before tournament).

Waiver: All archers and officials must sign a liability and photo waiver and agree to codes and pledges prior to participating in tournament activities. Archers under 18 years of age must also have a parent or legal guardian sign the waiver.

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GENERAL TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

Schedule: Schedule is subject to change due to weather delays, unforeseen conditions and final registration. The individual elimination rounds competition may extend up to sunset on Sunday April 7, 2013. If the tournament is stopped before completion, then the current archer standings at that time will be considered final.

2013 RECURVE Format:

- Recurve Adult and Junior Qualification Round: FITA Round (144 arrows) (all 6 arrow ends)
- Recurve Cadet Qualification Round: 60m Round (72 arrows) (all 6 arrow ends)
- Juniors will be combined with Adults for Olympic Elimination Round. (cut to 64, if necessary)
- Recurve Cadets will compete in Cadet Olympic Elimination Round. (cut to 32, if necessary)
- The Recurve Olympic Rounds will be utilizing the Set System per WA April 1, 2011 rules. (Best of 5 Sets, 3 arrow sets at 70m (Cadets at 60m) on 122cm faces)

2013 COMPOUND Format:

- Compound Qualification Round (all categories): 50m Round (72 arrows) (all 6 arrow ends)
- Juniors will be combined with Adults for Compound Elimination Round. (cut to 64, if necessary)
- Compound Cadets will compete in Cadet Compound Round. (cut to 32, if necessary)
- The Compound Elimination Rounds will be utilizing the Cumulative System per WA April 1, 2011 rules. (15 arrow matches, 5 ends x 3 arrows at 50m on 80cm(5-10) ring individual faces)

2013 Rules:

- All athletes, officials and coaches agree to abide by these USAA Codes and Pledges:

- USAA and World Archery rules, including dress codes. All archers must wear appropriate footwear including sport shoes covering the foot.
- Individuals shall comply with USA Archery dress code:
 1. All athletes and coaches must present a professional, athletic appearance while on the field. (Torn, ripped or badly faded clothing articles are not allowed.) Clothing may be of any color.
 2. No camo or blue denim (jeans) may be worn at target events. Accessories such as trim on shirts, caps, quivers, armguards, footwear, etc., are permitted to be camo. At field events, denim may be worn but camo may not be worn.
 3. Shorts, skorts and skirts must not be shorter than finger tip length while standing normally.
 4. Men and women are required to wear upper garments covering the front and back of the body and covering the midriff when at full draw. Women's upper garments shall have a minimum strap of 3" or sleeves. Men's upper garments shall have short or long sleeves.
 5. Sport/athletic shoes are recommended to all athletes and coaches during target events. Shoes must cover the entire foot.
 6. At no time will any athlete or coach wear any article bearing any image or language to be considered offensive to others.
- Official Team members shall comply with World Archery, Book 3 Dress Regulations
- A member association must be in good standing with no outstanding amounts payable to World Archery. A member association's archers may be put on a standby list until World Archery approves their status.
- Countries may enter an unlimited number of athletes. Registration is limited to venue capacity.
- Individuals are welcome to register directly with the tournament.



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2013 Categories: All Qualification ends are 6 arrow ends.

- Recurve Men and Recurve Junior Men: shooting 122cm faces at 90m/70m and 80cm (5-10 ring) individual faces at 50m/30m
- Recurve Women and Recurve Junior Women: shooting 122cm faces at 70m/60m and 80cm (5-10 ring) individual faces at 50m/30m
- Recurve Cadet Men: shooting 122cm faces at 60m (eligible for Cadet Elimination Rounds only)
- Recurve Cadet Women: shooting 122cm faces at 60m (eligible for Cadet Elimination Rounds only)
- All Compound, all categories: shooting 80cm (5-10 ring) individual faces at 50m.
- Para classified archers are welcome to participate and shoot the distances of the main categories. (Note: all archer positions are 1 meter wide) Para archers must comply with WA Book 3 equipment requirements to shoot in the open elimination round or team rounds. There is no Para elimination round. *Para archers shall provide their own agent.*
- Junior, Senior and eligible Para archers will be combined for final ranking for the individual elimination matches.
- Cadets, shooting as a cadet, are eligible to shoot in the Cadet only individual elimination matches.
- Please register for the correct category you are eligible and that you desire to compete in. Changing categories creates problems for the tournament.

National Team Round and Mixed National Team Round (Recurve 70m and Compound 50m):

Each World Archery Federation member association country may enter one team each in Men Recurve, Men Compound, Women Recurve and Women Compound National Team Rounds. A country may enter one Mixed Team each for Recurve and Compound. There is no separate Junior, Cadet, or Para Team Round. The country will identify their designated team members at registration. Eligible juniors and eligible compound cadets may be designated team members.

A national team will consist of their (3) highest ranked designated archers in the qualification round, unless the team captain otherwise notifies in writing to the Chairman of Judges one hour prior to the start of the eliminations. Their highest ranked designated Recurve man and woman form the Recurve mixed teams and highest ranked designated Compound man and woman form the Compound mixed teams, unless the team captain otherwise notifies in writing to the Chairman of Judges one hour prior to the start of the eliminations. Only those categories with two or more teams will be contested.

Open Teams (Recurve 70m and Compound 50m):

Arizona Cup Open Team Round is included in the registration and is open to all (except Recurve Cadets). Deadline to register an open team is 4:00pm on Friday, April 5 at the field. Open teams are typically corporate teams, collegiate teams or other, including impromptu teams arranged at the field by open competitors. No mixed open teams. Official Teams may also compete in the Open Team rounds. Countries may enter unlimited number of teams in the Open Team round. Open Teams will be cut to the first 16 teams who sign up per category. Don't have a team? Sign-up anyway because others may be looking for teammates.

Uncredentialed Coaches: Uncredentialed personal/private coaches must stay behind the spectator barrier. <http://www.arizonacup.com/2013/2013PersonalCoach.pdf>

Credentialed Coaches: Credentialed personal/private coaches and Credentialed Official Team Coaches are allowed up to the waiting line during scoring. Seating is reserved for the archers. No more than one coach per archer may be at the waiting line during shooting. **A list of private personal coaches is on the "Entries" web page. Only one credential is required to be purchased for a private coach. The private coach can coach multiple students. It is the responsibility of the Coach and their students to coordinate with each other issues regarding; credential reimbursement, payment and coaching. Archers should not assume if their coach is listed, that they will receive coaching.*



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Agents: Credentialed persons assisting Para archers or the tournament officials may sit in the archer's tents.

Photographers: Must be credentialed by the tournament to be allowed at the waiting line/photo lane, in blinds or down range. Photographers may not coach from waiting line/photo lane, in blinds or down range. Please read the http://www.arizonacup.com/2013/USAA_MEDIA_AND_PHOTO_POLICY-2012.pdf.

Shelter-Water: Shade canopies, seating and bottled water will be provided for the archers and credentialed officials.

Spectators:

- Complimentary shade and bleacher seating is provided for spectators.
- Spectators may erect their own shade canopies and seating behind the designated line and must be securely staked down.
- There is no entry fee for spectators.

Accreditation: All open individuals will be required to check-in at registration. Teams will be called to registration alphabetically. When called, official teams shall send their team leader to check-in at registration. All archers and credentialed coaches shall be required to have a waiver on file prior to competition. Archers under 18 years of age, will be required to have a parent or guardian sign their waiver.

Equipment Check: All archers will be required to have their equipment checked by tournament officials prior to competition. Random equipment checks may occur during the competition.

Scopes: Scopes on the line shall comply with World Archery rules.

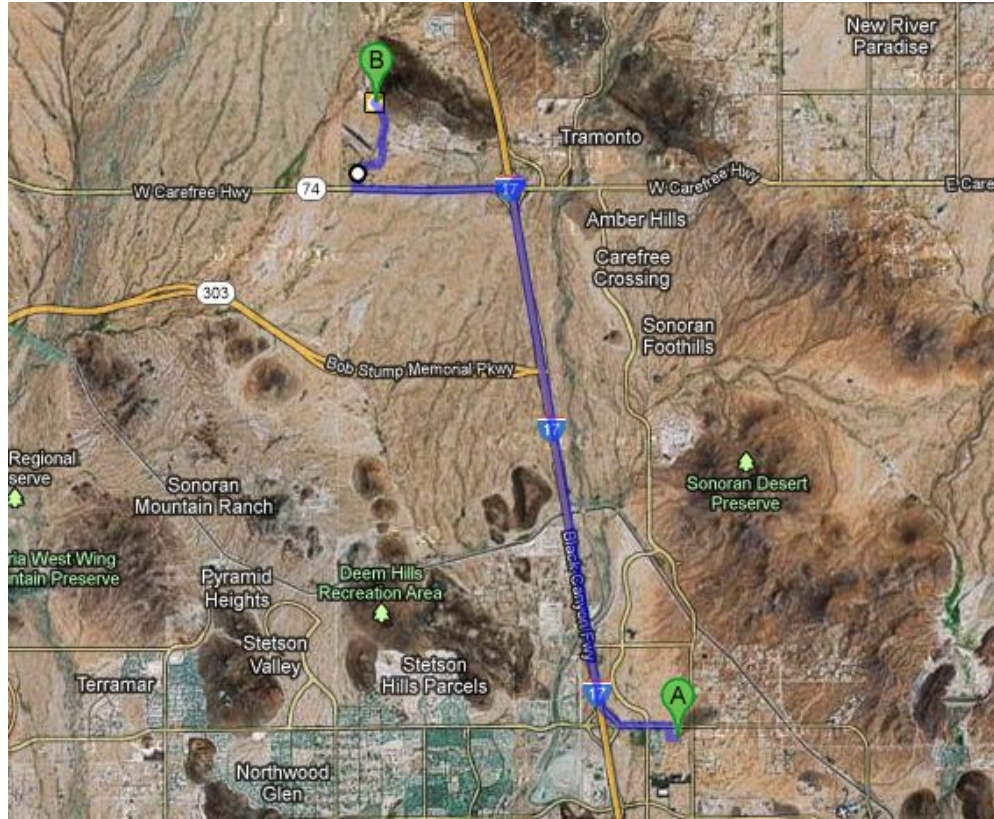

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING U.S. VISAs

Application for and obtaining travel visas to the United States are completely and solely the responsibility of the participant.

A visa will be required of all visitors to enter the United States with the exception of Canada and the 35 nations that are part of the "Visa Waiver Programme". The process for obtaining a visa requires each individual to submit an application through a U.S. Embassy or U.S. Consulate. **This is a process that MUST be done by the applicant – the organising committee cannot do it for you!**

Letter of Invitation – For those countries not listed above on the VISA waiver programme, the OC can issue you a Letter of Invitation to use in your application process, upon request. Full name, Birthday, passport number are required. At time of travel, passports should have at least 6 months before expiration.

How long should you expect the process to take? There is no standard timeframe for how long it takes to get an appointment for a visa interview and it can vary dramatically.

It cannot be emphasized enough to start the application process early.

PLEASE KEEP IN MIND – We cannot guarantee you will receive a VISA and we cannot provide special clearances, if you are denied or apply too late.
